Prestigious Dunlap Award Presented To Dennis Stead For His Outstanding Service

A hard working and very involved member of the Healdsburg Kiwanis Club since he joined in April 1999, Dennis Stead's contributions to the club, Kiwanis International and the community were recognized at the installation dinner on September 29 with the presentation of the very prestigious Dunlap Award.

The decision to honor Dennis was made by the board of directors at the September board meeting. In addition to the award, the board voted to contribute \$1,000 to Kiwanis House in his name.

Dennis has served on many committees and spearheaded many projects including the First Book Project, the Food Booth at the Future Farmers Country Fair, Fund Raising including the annual BBQ and auction held at Brandt's Beach, and participating in the founding of two new clubs in Division 32, Cloverdale and Willits.

Because he was entertaining out of town guests he was not present when the award was announced by 2008-2009 president Dennis Gary. However, Dennis' son-in-law, Vince Dougherty, phoned him and suggested that he should come to the Villa Annex immediately to receive his award which, after the ceremony ,Dennis called it "A Huge One".

Need To Rethink, Restructure Fundraiser

Disappointed in the results of the annual BBQ fundraiser and auction held in August at Brandt's Beach, chairman Dennis Stead told the membership that "we need to make changes". Suggested changes were: change to a Friday evening to avoid conflicts with other events, adhere to the minimum bids, have members prepare and serve the barbecue, reservations be required, make contact with other clubs in the division. He pointed out that the club had guaranteed the caterer 100 dinners but only 75 showed up. Since he could not participate this year he extended his appreciation to his committee – Ken Scharer, John Bippart, Roger Dormire, Dennis Gary, Chris Metrulas, Jerry Strong, Pete Peterson. Vince Dougherty took on the duties of auctioneer. The \$6,564 funds raised were applied to the administration fund to help defray a deficit.

Board Approves Donation To Raven Players, Appoints Conrad

At its September 9 meeting the board of directors approved a donation to the Healdsburg Raven Players and appointed Hunt Conrad to take over the position on the board vacated by the resignation of Douglas Newton.

Ron Dobley suggested that the club donate \$500 to the annual fundraising drive of the Raven Players. He pointed out that the \$500 contribution "would bring the club a prominent mention in each of the Players' programs". Also noted was the overall excellence of the productions and the community's support for the local theatre.

A suggestion that the club contribute \$33 toward immediate past Lt. Governor Richard Fuller's lifetime membership was not approved but approved was a donation of \$11 toward the membership since, it was pointed out, Fuller had only attended one of our meetings but that it was customary for the Lt. Governor to pay three official visits.


Hunt Conrad whose term of office was expiring agreed to stay on for one more year taking the place of Doug Newton who recently resigned from the club.

A request from the Public Schools Success Team for \$3,000 was tabled until the October meeting. The board suggested that a representative of the PSST appear and give more information. The PSST, a new program to help more students graduate from Healdsburg High School, spoke at a club meeting explaining that PSST is starting with a pilot program with one fifth grade class which it will follow through high school graduation. The Team requested \$3,000 to fund the cost of processing the clearance process for each of the 33 tutors.

It was noted in the treasurer's report that the President's Fund, the charity fund, collected at each meeting from the membership, is deposited each week in the Administration Fund. However, its balance is tracked and is transferred to the Project Fund when the president determines how to spend it. A further discussion of the President's Fund and his/her discretion on how to spend the funds, will come before the board at the October meeting.

Fund Raising Dinner Cancelled

A fund raiser for the administration fund that was also billed as a fun social evening planned by Rick Norman was cancelled. Rick said that for the event to be successful 20 couples needed to sign up and attend and that goal was not reached. The dinner at the home of Richard and Barbara Thomas on September 19 was to feature wines around the world plus pizza and dinner. The cost was \$100 per couple.
