Tom Roscoe chairman of our major emphasis project introduced John Meola, coordinator of the Sonoma County Neighborhood Watch Crime Prevention Program. John gave a fine talk on Crime Prevention in the home. Some of the statistics were alarming. Ten safeguards against crime are as follows;

Secure locks (preferably dead bolts and pin-fall locks) on your doors and windows.

Lock house even when home.

Don't leave your keys in "hiding places." such as in your mail box or under your doormat.

Keep an outdoor light on at night.

Use automatic timers to regulate lights while you are away.

Install a burglar alarm that sets off a noise, floodlights or both.

Don't keep valuables around the house.

If you must have valuables at home, mark them with an electric pencil, available at your police department.

Don't keep handguns at home.

Know your neighbors and check up on each other's safety.

Take a moment to check your home to see how it stacks up with this list.
