
This meeting will consist of PartI and Part II. First, observance of the 20th anniversary of receiving our Charter.

We were pleased to have four visiting members present including George Imrie from Napa, our Mother club.

In remembrance of 20 years ago, Russ presented the charter to Finnly, and George Imrie gave the president-elect the 200 pound inscribed gavel which the Napa Kiwanians left with our group in 1923.

Many congratulatory messages on our anniversary have been received, and it is interesting to know that we were Club No. 40 in the California-Nevada District. There are now 154. In twenty years, the Healdsburg Kiwanis Club has furnished three Lieutenant-Governors, won an Achievement Award, and now is providing the District Governor.

"Then the Dig noise is over" said the officer, "I want to live in Healdsburg." The best part of his speech.


The night of December 14th we meet at Lytton Home. Keep this date in mind.
