





Program Notes:

Don Anderson, program chairman for this week, has announced that we will hear "Trends in Travel," presented by John Lloyd, AMTRAK, PAN AMERICAN, and Scott Singley, SITMAR Cruiser.

Last week, designated Farmer/City week, Harry McCracken, Sonoma County Agricultural Commissioner, talked on the use of pesticides and the problems associated with their control He lead off by stating tha California is the only State to have Agricultural Commissioners and their duties are many: primarily regulatory, but also responsible for inspection of plants and animals and the conduct of surveys of diseases and pests to eradicate them before they become a problem. He pointed out that there is more and more demand by various groups and the State to rigidly control the use of pesticides, in spite of the few cases reported where people may have been exposed. Proposed regulations could make approval of permits a long-drawn-out process, which could only make life more difficult and more expensive for the farmer.

Senior members are reminded that they are obligated to attend one meeting per month or they will be delinquent.


