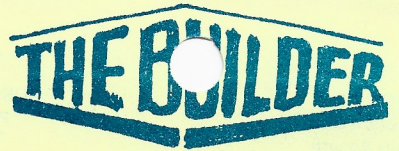
ANNOUNCEMENTS

NO FORMAL MEETING TODAY. You must come to the hall and sign-in to receive meeting credit. Sign up time between 12 Noon and 1 P.M.

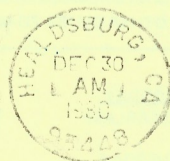
