

At the regular Tuesday Luncheon meeting on December 11th, and by unanimous vote of the membership, the Healdsburg Kiwanis Club approved a Resolution pledging each member to compliance with all efforts to alleviate the National Energy Crises, and the urging of all citizens to do likewise. The text of the Resolution is as follows:

# RESOLUTION OF THE HEALDSBURG KIWANIS CLUB

WHEREAS: There presently exists a worldwide energy crisis which affects all peoples in all places, and

WHEREAS: The people of the United States, particularly in areas of extreme cold, will suffer as a result of energy shortages, and

WHEREAS: We of the Healdsburg area can and must cooperate in all manner for the benefit of those who will suffer, and

WHEREAS: We as Kiwanians have formed together for service to our communities and nation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That each and every one of us Kiwanians and citizens pledge to cooperate in every way, and more specifically as follows:

- 1. Drive at or below the speed of 55 miles per hour, and
- 2. Maintain heat levels in our homes and businesses at  $68^{\circ}$  or lower, and
- 3. Conserve on all lighting requirements and turn off all lights not in use, and to minimize all non-essential lighting such as Christmas lights, flood lights not needed for security, etc., and
- 4. To support all other requested energy conservation programs, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Healdsburg Kiwanis Club requests all citizens of the Healdsburg area to similarly cooperate in the united efforts to solve the energy crisis.
