
week because if that were the case then we wouldn't have any members left at all. But come when you can and help out when you can.

## **Meetings**

Nov 1: Richard Iverson, Letters from a WWI Soldier

Richard recently became reacquainted with his father-in-law Ralph K. Chase, with the rediscovery of a stash of letters of written by Ralph during his service in World War 1 to his mother.



Richard has written a book, chronicling these letters in which Ralph described his experiences in France, "Letters From A WWI Soldier".

Richard introduced us to his father-in-law and summarized several interesting excerpts from the letters. One described a visit to an underground German bunker at the end of the war. The bunkers were living quarters for the German soldiers throughout the war and were equipped with all the basic necessities. The soldiers were very thankful that it was over.

Copies of Richard's book are in the Smithsonian and the Soldiers Memorial Military Museum in St. Louis.

**Nov 8: Dick Bugarske -** The year is 1923. What is the origin story of Healdsburg Kiwanis?

Dick put together very interesting presentation of what was happening in 1923 and the origin of our club.

Great things were happening in 1923:

- Healdsburg Kiwanis is Accepted by Kiwanis International to Form a Club on July 10, 1923.
- Yankee Stadium opened on April 18, 1923.
- The Hollywood sign was erected in LA.
- Rosenberg's in Healdsburg advertised "Good Shoes at Unheard Prices", Ladies shoes, \$1.00, Men's Oxfords, \$3.95.
- Modern Cottages with garage rented for \$21 to \$34.

Healdsburg Kiwanis immediately became involved in civil affairs. August 1923 headlines: "Kiwanis Vote for closing on Friday", "Kiwanis out for Permanent Dam".

Here are some early explanations in the rather pompous language of the day of what Kiwanis is about:

According to its sponsors, Kiwanis is an organization of virile, progressive, right thinking, broad-minded business and professional men. Its membership is formed by the careful and discriminating selection of the most representative men in their particular calling---men who, by virtue of their talents can be relied upon cheerfully to cooperate with their fellow members in actively supporting the Kiwanis movement in its steady unfaltering march toward the attainment of its high ideals.

Kiwanis is more than a club; it is an attitude of mind; an application of that sane American spirit, which is what it is because it is constructive and not destructive, set in its purpose "to make two blades of grass grow where one grew before"; an American spirit of humanity; of generosity; of helpfulness; of good cheer; a spirit nourished by its belief in the home as the center of permanent social advancement.

#### Nov 22: Dick Bugarske

Thanksgiving is a special holiday for many popular reasons—the food, the family, and football are just a few. Less well known, however, are the many fascinating facts behind the holiday's history, traditions, and myths. The truth is, for many of us, there's a lot we don't know about the holiday we celebrate every fourth Thursday in November. So before carving up your family's turkey this year, we are going to explore some of the many interesting Dick B Presented some Thanksgiving facts could find that we can use during Thanksgiving dinner conversation! Here are a few:

• The event commonly referred to as the first Thanksgiving was celebrated in October 1621. It was organized by Governor William Bradford of Plymouth, Massachusetts, to celebrate the recent immigrants' first corn harvest in the New World. While the meal lacked much of what is now common Thanksgiving fare - there's no record of turkey being served, for example – there were at least five deer carcasses present, and the event lasted a full three days.

- Two Thanksgivings were celebrated in 1939. Responding to lobbying by department stores, President Roosevelt issued an executive order moving Thanksgiving one week earlier. FDR's opponents objected moving the holiday from the traditional date and called it "Franksgiving". Several states ignored FDR's order and did not move the holiday. Some things never change Republicans and Democrats cannot agree on anything.
- In a 2020 YouGov poll, tofu was the most unpopular element of a potential Thanksgiving meal.
