



Citizen advocates are needed to volunteer time to help these disabled people live more normal and meaningful lives. Miss Seelner said that 80% of people in mental hospitals never have anyone visit them.



The program last week featuring Dr. Russell J. Striff was very interesting and well presented. Dr. Striff discussed early identification of spinal defects in young people. Some of his comments:

- 1. 10% of children in this area in grades 6-8 have scoliosis.
- 2. Fountain Valley experience used in setting up a program in Healdsburg.
- 3. All students in grades 6 through 8 screened by school nurse and volunteer nurses trained by Dr. Striff to pick up deformity. Positives given free ex-rays at the hospital and referred to family doctors.
- 4. Treatment is to wear a brace for 5 to 6 years, Cost of brace \$800.
- 5. Scolivsis is probably hereditary. Our thanks to Glen Davis for arranging this informative program.
