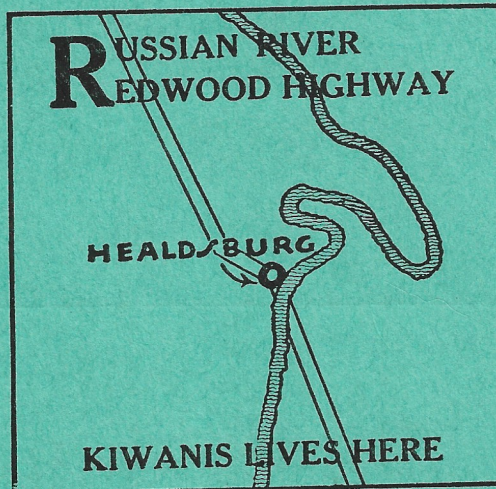
## INSTALLATION NIGHT

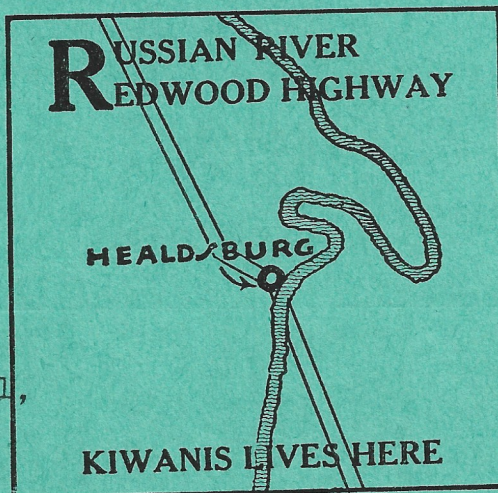

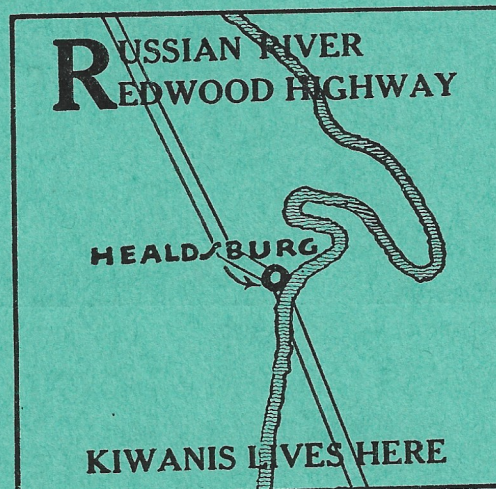

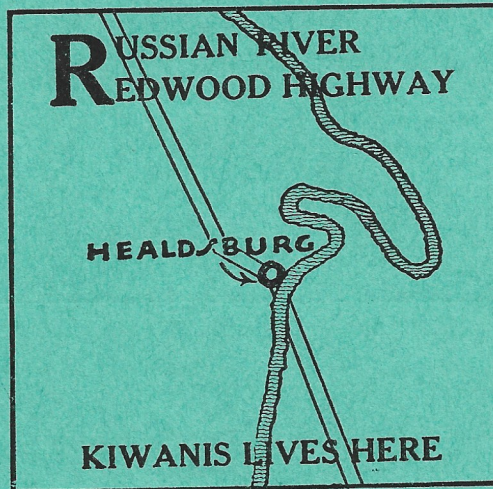
