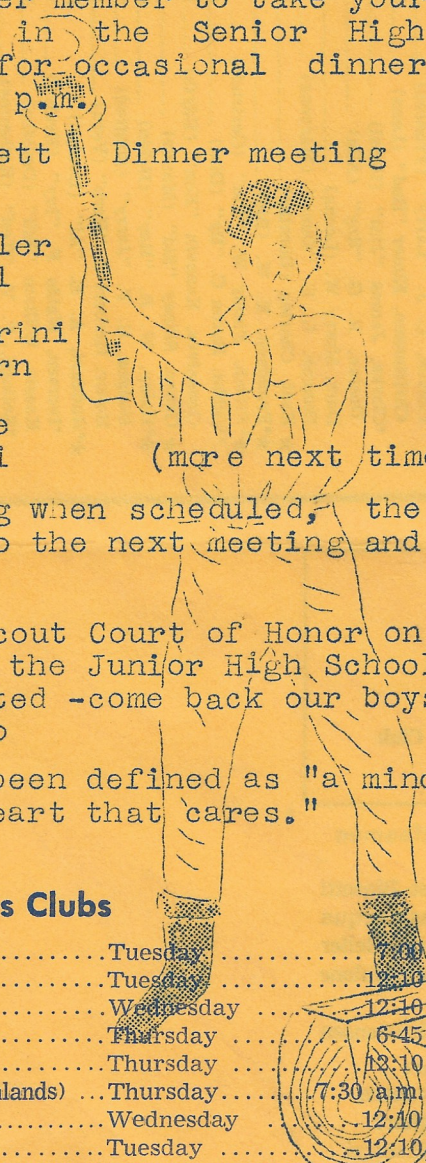

Boys and Girls Work

1 meeting 3 members present. Approved bills for needy students. Mapped further plans for year's program. Boys Scout Group gave comprehensive report to Kiwanis including recommendations on projects which they could support. The Scout Committee appears to be extremely active.

Circle K and Key Clubs

1 meeting 4 members present. The Kiwanis Club is going to aid the Key Club in a project involving street number painting to bolster Key Club treasury. Worked with Key Club members in putting on annual Fathers-Sons Banquet for local Boys Club. Both clubs are swapping personnel at meetings.

Vocational Guidance

1 meeting 6 members present. A visit to the California Employment Bureau in Santa Rosa in search of information and suggestions as to the part Kiwanis can play in the Vocational Guidance Program was planned. The high school and employment bureau are cooperating in a practical program, but the role of the third party is still unclear. Several large corporations have recently tried to provide special programs for young people to help qualify them for suitable jobs, but to date the results are unknown.

Agriculture and Conservation

1 meeting 5 members present. This committee met after the close of the Tuesday, March 3 meeting of the club. Chairman Kellogg read a resolution from the Redwood Region Conservation Council thanking the committee for their aid in fire prevention work. The committee okayed the goldfish Kiwanis at the FFA Fair, and authorized the purchase of 1200 fish. Bruno Rodella was put in charge of making equalizing bids for FFA and 4-H members at the FFA Country Fair. The committee agreed to head up the entrance of a Kiwanis float in the Country Fair.

International Relations

1 meeting 3 members present. Arranged for two programs for club luncheon meetings - one featured two exchange students - one from Argentina and one from Healdsburg that studied in Spain last year. The other program featured Robert Bishop who traveled extensively in South America and discussed the poverty of that continent.

Public and Business Affairs

1 meeting 3 members present. Still working on June primary and November elections. Also active on K local school board bond election to be held in April.
