
Chairman Says Tree Lot Big Success Give Yourselves Round of Applause

"Give yourselves a round of applause. It was the smoothest year yet. "he stressed.


All but 15 of the 1360 trees were sold.

HEF Seeks Funds for Jr. High

Members of the Healdsburg Education Foundation appeared before the Kiwanis Board of Directors on January 14 at the high school library and asked the Kiwanis Club again to be the leader and provide the initial \$18,000 for 18 computers for the Junior High School library renovation. The Kiwanis Club

supplied the initial \$6500 of the \$147,000 high school library remodeling program.

In oher business the financial report was accepted. It was noted that project funds currently available amount to \$65,832 out of a total of \$88,382.

President Dennis Gary advised that he would explore Kiwanis Foundation scholarships and the scholarship committee was directed to look further into maximizing any available funds.

With the City's Park and Recreation Department considering a 5.04 increase per member per meeting as a result of the increased costs to caterers, a discussion on a possible move to another location for the weekly meeting, possibly Tayman Park, took place.

It was announced that the 2009 Mid Year Kiwanis Conference will take place in Sacramento on February 21 and that the 2008 Christmas Tree lot cash flow shows a net profit of \$38,075 for 2009.
