President Nancy Curnow convened the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. in the Healdsburg Police Department. The following officers were present: President Nancy Curnow, Vice President Jerry Strong, Second Vice President Dan Maraviglia, Secretary Neil Iversen, Administrative Treasurer Dennis Gary and Past President Tim Tuscany. Board members: Jim Birdsong, Yolanda Rinaldo, Todd Brandt, Dennis Stead and John Dayton. Visiting was Victoria Shipley to earn her membership badge.

Dan Maraviglia moved we accept the minutes of the January 9th board meeting, Dennis Stead seconded the motion

and it passed.

Secretary's Report: All bills were paid as of February 11, 2003. DUES: From January 9 to February 12 we collected \$4,533 from 36 active and 7 senior members.

OTHER NOTES: I plan to draw \$800 from the Scout budget to pay for utilities for 1 year at Clary Hall for Troop 21.

MEMBERSHIP: Thomas F. Barron, former member of Geyserville Kiwanis, wants to join Healdsburg. He has attended two meetings and is ready to pay his assessment next week. Because he resigned from Geyserville over a year ago, it will cost him \$45 membership fees besides his \$53 balance due on this quarter.

RESIGNATIONS: Sad News. Dale Lynch is resigning due to health reasons as of January 31, 2003. And Dorsey Crogan also is resigning due to health reasons. The secretary tried to talk Dorsey into becoming a senior member but he said

he was not interested.

After comments and additions by board members, Tim Tuscany moved we accept his report, Yolanda Rinaldo seconded the motion and it passed.

(B) Yolanda Rinaldo reported on the "Relay for Life" Cancer Fund Drive to take place at the Healdsburg High School on May 31 and June 1, 2003. By moving it from August to June this comes just after the Future Farmers Country Fair and before the Fitch Mountain Foot Race on Sunday, June 8. So many felt we would have poor attendance. Yolanda said Tim Tuscany will be the chairman for the Kiwanis team. President Nancy suggested we have Dennis Stead as the program on February 18 to go over with the club his ideas on

saving money for the administrative fund and Yolanda can talk on the Relay for Life.

Club.

(6) MEMBERSHIP: Dennis Stead came up with a plan to help build our membership: if you bring in 3 or more members a year, you will get \$100 off on your quarterly dues. Tim Tuscany so moved that we accept this plan, Todd Brandt seconded the motion and it passed. (7) TREE PLANTING: Two years ago we planted trees north of town at the end of Poppy Hill Drive. Dennis Stead advised that some trees have died, should we replace them and make tree planting a 2003 project? Board is not interested at present.


