

## Committee Meets With City Officials To Confirm Facts on Proposed Rental Increase at Villa Annex

Dennis Stead and his committee including City Councilman Gary Plass met with Community Services Director David Mickaelian to discuss and iron out information received by Kiwanis on a proposal to increase the rental fees substantially at the Villa Annex. The meeting, held on Friday, February 20., was attended by Ken Scharer, Rick Norman, Jack Brandt, Gary Plass and Dennis Stead who initiated the meeting.

In his initial report Dennis informed the club that according to information received the rent would go from \$74 per week (\$3500 per year) to over \$300 per week (\$17,000 per year). Dennis explained that the city proposed to charge the caterers a 15% surcharge per rental plus \$3.15 per place setting. The change in rental fees for the Villa and the Annex were formulated at the suggestion from a consulting firm who saw the need to charge more for the facility for companies and outside businesses for conventions and meetings and for wedding parties and receptions. However, local non profits stressed that these increased fees should not apply to them.

In retrospect, the city officials agreed that the increases should only be for others than non profits.

Mickaelian advised the committee that the city wants to recoup the cost of doing business and in the case of the Kiwanis Club recoup the cost of having an employee on the premises for five hours to set up the table and chairs before the caterers arrive and to put the tables and chairs away after the meeting. The cost of this is \$22 per hour bringing the (please see page 3)
