We served 850 people and everything ran smoothly, thanks to all of you.

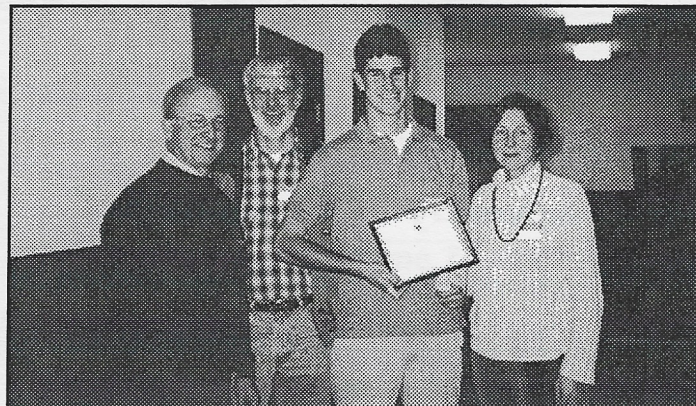
I pass this responsibility over to Jerry Strong and know that we will be out in full force to help him in 2003.

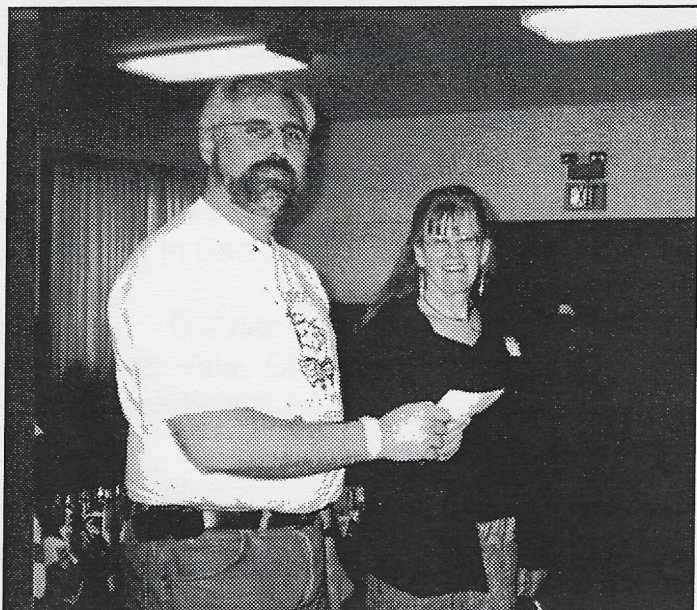
Dylan Frazer, son of Ann and Donald Frazer, was the recipient of the Student of the Month and was presented to the club members at the March 5 meeting.

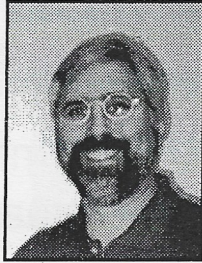

**MINUTES:** The minutes of February 14 were corrected. Article VI-(1): Digital Camera: Dennis Stead reported he voted NO and Haley seconded the motion. Nancy Curnow moved the minutes of February 14 be approved as corrected, Rich Iversen seconded the motion and it passed.

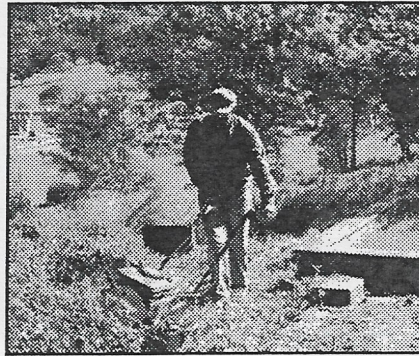
