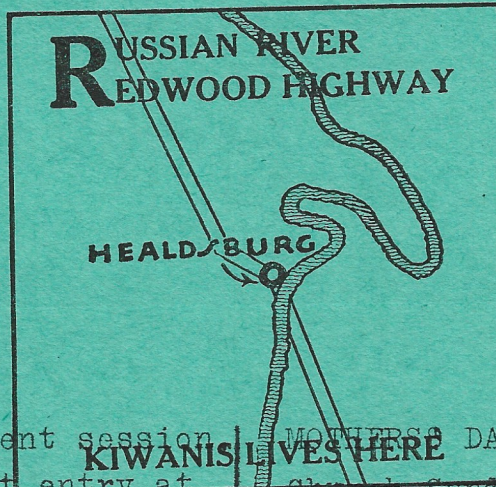

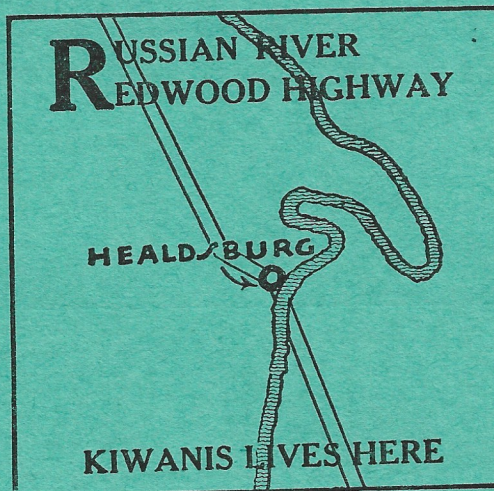
Again, Chairman Len Gilbert, with another one of his outstanding programs -

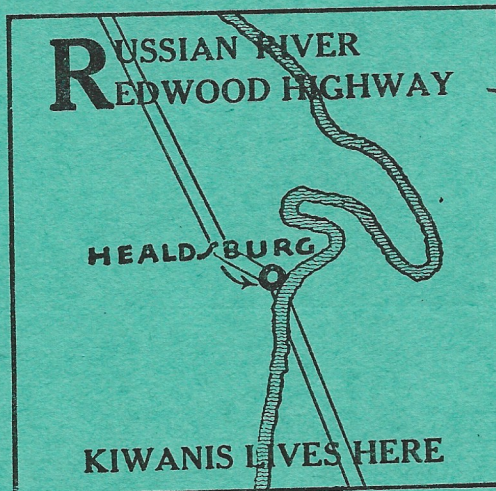
