# Ready, Set, Go! Annual Fitch Mountain Foot Race 2004 Underway on Sunday, June 13



If you haven't signed up for the annual Healdsburg Kiwanis foot race, a 10K and 3K run/walk, you still have time to do so. The deadline is Tuesday, June 8. The foot race, a benefit for the Kiwanis Club's Memorial Scholarship Fund, is scheduled to take place on Sunday, June 13 starting at the Healdsburg Plaza Square at 8 a.m. Registration begins at 7 a.m. at the Square. All registered runners will receive a commemorative T-Shirt.

The entry fee for adults, 13 to 59, is \$20. For chidren, 12 and under and seniors 60 and over, the fee is \$15. There is no fee for a child under 12 years of age running with a registered parent. Late entry fee for adults, 13-59, is \$25.

If club members have any questions about the assignments please contact Joe Engler. The committee stressed the importance of members showing up for the assignment on time. Everyone should be in place by 7:30 a.m. An orange vest will be brought to you at your assigned location.

Lee Gunnerson, chairman of the Fitch Mountain Foot Race, pointed out that the foot race could not be a financial success without the generous donations of the sponsors. The fee is \$250 each and at least 17 will be participating this year as sponsors.

The award ceremony will be held at the Plaza Square immediately following the race. Medals will be presented to the first place winners in both the adult men and women's divisions as well as ribbons in other categories. Refreshments for the race participants will be available also at the Plaza Square.

Proceeds from the Fitch Mountain Foot Race go to the Healdsburg Memorial Scholarship Fund. Income from the fund helps to award scholarships to Healdsburg High School graduating seniors.

Nimmo , Kory Whitaker, son of Jeanne and William Whitaker and James B. Hickman, Jr., son of Juliann and James Hickman, all of Healdsburg. Only Kory Whitaker was able to attend the Kiwanis meeting. Laurie Nimmo, Healdsburg High School Scholarship Coordinator who worked with the Scholarship Committee, read thank you letters from the other two recipients. Each of the three young men were presented with the scholarships, worth \$2,000 each, at the Healdsburg High School Awards Night on May 17 by Tom Rackerby. 

and he was in the air freight business. After moving to Healdsburg he worked on remodeling his home and since then, with a friend, has been doing work as a carpenter.




Sponsor Chris Metrulas, left, and Membership Chairman Todd Brandt, right, congratulate newly inducted member Bruce Main .
