Board Hears Plans To Establish A Teen Center at Boys and Girls Club

At a special meeting of the board on May 31, members authorized President Dan Maraviglia to enter into a contract with the Baptist Church of Windsor to


purchase a five year old 24 x 60 modular building to be placed on the Healdsburg Boys and Girls property, behind the main building. The building will be used as a Teen Center giving the community, once again, a place for our teenage population to meet and call its own.

Dan will negotiate with the pastor of the Baptist Church offering a down payment of \$10,000 with additional payments over a period of six months to a year. The modular unit will cost \$37,000 installed but there will be additional expenses bringing the project total expense to about \$45,000. The City of Healdsburg has already granted the club \$7,500 for the project from the city's development fund.

Kiwanian Richard Norman who is spearheading the construction project suggested that the club offer a \$10,000 down payment with additional payments over a designated time. The church is selling the modulars to finance new construction at the church

It has not yet been decided whether the club will undertake this project as its own or will seek donations from the public or other service organizations.

It was suggested that the new Teen Center be named in memory of Karl Esposti, a long time member of the Boys and Girls Club board, who recently died in a plane crash.
