

The MARKET functions as a service to growers who wish to sell their produce to the public. The Farmers Market is a non profit operation, charging a fee of 10% of each vendors gross sales which is used to cover actural outlay in the maintenance, insurance, and other incidental costs attendent to the Market's existence. The C.E.T.A. funding is being phased out, so the Market, if it is to continue, will have to provide its own financial support. The Market is open Tuesdays and Saturdays.

At a recent Dinner Dance, and Auction, the Farmers Market raised some \$2000.00 net. That should give us an idea as to how well it is being supported here in Healdsburg, and its favorable acceptance.


