

Loren (new member) Lewis as Program Chairman, introduced Sgt. Charles Smith of the Sonoma County Narcotics Bureau. Charles Smith covered interesting ground, much of it also pertinent to our membership. 1960 witnessed the renaissance of drug abuse - with all sorts of drugs available and no government force to cope with the problem involved. By 1970, the government crack down had developed to an effective point. The profi motive from pushing narcotics initially provoked the younger people to become involved. Professional and unscrupulous drug dealers then moved in and forced the younger and newer pushers out - with widespread violence. Enforcement in Sonoma County, not the final solution to our drug problem, does keep people honest and holds the lid on the problem. 93% of drug arrests result in convictions. Charles Smith has a team of agents working seven days a week buying and convicting. Each agent averages about 70 hours a week. In turn, the Sheriff does support the NARC Team. His question and answer period, like his formal presentation, was intensely interesting. It's good to know that we have the likes of Charles Smith on our side.

Guests - Walter Egan, Sonoma County Superintendent of Schools, and Jim Halverson, President of Santa Rosa Downtown Club. Discussion followed their introduction about a missing bell needed by the Downtown Club to crank up a new Kiwanis Club In Rohnert Park. Dave Hinton, program chairman, introduced Holbrook Teeter, Chief Psychiatric Social Worker at Lytton Salvation Army. He gave us a thumbnail sketch on the history of Lytton, which started as an orphanage and later turned into a retreat center - and eventually and currently an Adult Rehabilitation Center. Lytton now works with addicted men, mainly alcohol some with dual addiction (alcohol and drugs). at Lytton is 64 people at any one time. Lytton supports itse Capacity at Lytton is 64 people at any one time. Lytton supports itself by do-nations from the public of household effects and other personal effects which are in turn repaired or processed as necessary and put into Retail Store Outlets. This includes the counties of Sonoma, Mendocino, Lake, Napa, and Solano. Religious services are also included in the Lytton program as well as group therapy and recreation activities. Consideration is now being given to opening up aswomen!s unit to parallel the men"s, and it is expected this will happen within the next year.

He then discussed causes and cures of alcoholism. Acoholics Anonymous has been determined to be the most effective single sure and this is included in the Lytton program. Causes are many - not one paramount as in the cure cycle.

Questions and Answers were equally interesting. Most pertinent: men are expected to, and do, work a forty-hour work week. This is a basic part of their therapy. In exchange they are given board and room, clothes, if needed, a full blown therapy program, plus a few dollars a week of spending money.
