Boys and Girls Work
1 meeting - 3 members present. Made a presentation to the Board of Directors for the purchase of an audiometer for the Fitch Mountain Elementary School. The request was approved and the elementary school will have a hearing testing machine which will be used not only to test over 1500 students, but also by some local doctors as the need indicates.

Circle K and Key Clubs
1 meeting - 4 members present. Talked to the principal of senior high school, and found slate of new officers has been duly installed and two new co-advisors will be ready to launch club in fall. The club has some unused project money in their treasury and they are going to improve some area of the high school this fall.

Vocational Guidance
1 meeting - 3 members present. Work on project with high school for use of vocational (Perkins Act) to improve and upgrade business department so that more students will be capable of immediate employment after graduation. A definite effort is being made by this committee to explore the many avenues of how we can best meet the job needs for our youth, including both graduate and drop-outs.

Agriculture and Conservation

1 meeting - 4 members present. Following the club's regular meeting of Tuesday, July 28th, this committee met and review the distribution of Fire Prevention materials. Chairman Kellogg asked the members to bring to the next committee meeting - suggestions and names of qualified speakers for the program in November for Farm-City Week. Also discussed and planned was the participation of our club in the planting of 50 trees in the community commemorating the club's fifteenth anniversary. Members were asked to contact Schools, churches, parks, Etc. for locations for this planting. Kellogg announced the available nursery trees from the nursery of the Forestry Service.

International Relations

1 meeting - 3 members present. Arranged an outstanding program for the Kiwanis Club featuring Chinese customs and traditions. The committee also ordered a new set of international flags so that all countries in Kiwanis International could be duly recognized.

Public and Business Affairs

1 meeting - 3 members present. This committee arranged two excellent programs for the club this month. One featuring industrial development of our own county; the other investments.

Support of Churches In Their Spiritual Aims

1 meeting - 3 members present.
