

## Barbecue and Auction Nets \$11, 300 For The Club's Administrative Fund

Dennis Stead, chairman of the annual Barbecue and Auction held to help offset the costs in the administrative fund, reported that this year's event was "bigger and better" than ever. He said that the event netted \$11,300 and that 110 Kiwanians, family members and guests including Kiwanis members from Cloverdale helped to make this year's fund raiser a success.

Dennis said that \$1,410 was taken in at the gate, \$360 at the bar, \$8,650 from the live auction, \$2,664 from the silent auction and \$750 from the members prepaid lunches, bringing a total gross of \$13,834. Expenses came to \$2,534 giving the club a net of \$11,300. The dinner was catered by Trend Catering. Dennis said that the long single line at the buffet will be changed next year so that the guests won't have to endure such a long wait. The servers will arrange for two lines so that the dinner can be served in a faster fashion.

In the live auction top bidder for one of the items was Bob Young who successfully bid \$2100 for a bronze sculpture, sculpted and cast by Betty Saletta in 1990 and donated by Jim Schmidt.

Donna Young bid \$950 to stay three nights and four days at John Bippart's beautiful Bodega Bay home located across from the golf course's club house.

Jim Lucchesi successfully bid \$850 for a paella dinner for 20 cooked by Gerard Nebesky, chef to TV personalities.

John Dayton and friends are looking forward to a prime rib dinner for 10 prepared by club member Sean Thomas. Successful bid for this event was \$600.

A Pontoon party on Lake Sonoma, donated by Gary and Lorraine Plass, will be enjoyed by Cloverdale Kiwanian Ernie Frandsen who offered \$400 for this prize.

Joining outdoor columnist and Kiwanis member Hunt Conrad for a day of fishing on the wild and scenic Klamath river will be Guy French and Phil Luks who bid \$850 for this special excursion.
